
Mrs. Streeter passed away August 28, 1999


Lawndale High School is one of only 4 high schools that make up the Centinela Valley Union High School District. The CVUHSD was formed in 1905 and was originally known as the Inglewood Union High School District. It was made up of Hawthorne, Inglewood, Jefferson (later Lennox), and Wiseburn School Districts. The name was changed to Centinela Valley Union High School District in 1944.

Lawndale High School first opened in 1959. It was closed 22 years later in



1981. LHS reopened in 1998, and now has over 2,000 students and 91 teachers. Our very own Mrs. Sharon Curto is back teaching at Lawndale High! She will be at the reunion. Make sure to look for her.


